Background:

In April 2016, the Government announced a continuation of funding for Physical Education (PE) and sport until 2020. This funding is used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. The funding is for the period 1 September 2023 - 31 August 2024. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make an impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools. We are also required to report on the progress of swimming by the time the children leave in Year.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

During the financial year April 2023 to March 2024, we plan to spend our funding in the following areas:

- Buy a package from a well-respected sports organisation; Premier Education
- Provide greater opportunities for PE across the school using a new PE scheme.
- Provide free after school clubs in sport.
- Provide opportunities for competitive sport and off-site festivals
- Provide opportunities for KS1 to swim to increase water confidence ready for KS2.
- Provide new equipment as required to link with the new scheme
