In Science we have been learning about forces. We used force meters to measure the force of lifting and the force of dragging our shoes. We used Newtons (N) to measure the force.











We have also started to write our historical stories set in the Iron Age. Part of this is using speech punctuation, which we are finding a bit tricky! There are lots of things to remember. We enjoyed playing 'Guess the way I am saying it'. This helps us to learn different ways of saying 'said'.

Oak Class



Happy New Year!

What a full-on start to the new year we have had in Oak Class! We have hit the ground running this half term as we get closer and closer to the SATs tests in May.

In reading, we have finally finished our class book – Secrets of a Sun King. We have all really enjoyed reading the book and it was described by some members of the class as 'the best

book I've ever read'. On the back of this, we then wrote a third person narrative based on a modern-day version of the book. The children have been immersed and motivated with this piece of writing and the excitement level has been off the scale – one child has even written 7 pages in her narrative! We are hoping to word process our pieces so we can share our finished narratives with you!

In history, we have been looking at the Battle of Marathon between Persia and Athens. We were intrigued to find out that the smaller Athenian Army defeated the Persian Army by using their stronger soldiers around the outside of their battle lines to surround and box the enemy in. We reenacted this battle in the classroom, which was great fun!

In computing, we have been tinkering with scratch to create pieces of music to create soundtracks. These have been great to hear, and it has been interesting to see the children thinking so carefully about how to create sounds that link to our topic of space. In the next couple of weeks, we will be planning and programming our own soundtrack.

Homework is back in full force! Reminder – it goes out on a Thursday and back in the following Wednesday! Reading Records in on a Friday too!
