Acorn Class



Acorn class have been looking at making patterns in maths. We have been using different objects to create patterns.

We have continued our Marvelous me topic and been looking at our families and homes. We made our own clay houses and are gradually painting them.

This week we have been learning about our senses and we went on a listening walk.

In phonics nursery children have been singing nursery rhymes and Reception have been learning our RWI initial sounds. We are doing really well at starting to blend c-a-t and listening carefully to work out the word.

We are continuing to enjoy all the physical activities, especially digging and using the bikes.







Maple Class



In Maple class, we worked on reading different poems and finding rhyming words. Also, we created our own poems about the four seasons. Children worked so hard, and their poems came out wonderfully. They are now on our Proud Wall.



1 - Class Poems

On 27th of September, we had our adults in for a reading open morning, and we learned the poem 5 Little leaves. Together we produced some actions to help us remember the poem. On Friday, we performed the poem in front of everyone in school! That was a bit scary, but we were brilliant!!!

Rowan Class



In Rowan Class we have been learning about the Stone Age in history. We found out that woolly mammoths became extinct because they were hunted by humans. We were amazed to find out that scientists have used DNA to discover that Cheddar Man, who died 10,000 years ago, had blue eyes.

In Design and Technology we have been finding out how to make material stiffer. We tested different methods and then decided on the best one to use. Hairspray works well; cornflour and water leave a white residue, but PVA glue works the best. We used this to stiffen the material to make our glasses, moustaches and lips.















Oak Class



We enjoyed another good few weeks in Oak Class and have begun to produce some really high levels of independent work in a range of the curriculum areas.

In our daily maths morning sessions, we have been focusing on the Year 6 Arithmetic questions and especially some of the trickier fraction questions. The children in Year 5 have also been having a good attempt at these too and I am impressed with how quickly the children are picking up the tips and strategies to help them answer these styles of questions (some topics of which we have not really covered yet!). Children – can you challenge your adults at home to have a go at these three questions?

- 1. 1/3 divided by 7 =
- 1. 4 2/4 7/8 =
- 1. 15 7.645 =

Did they get them correct? Can you talk them through the strategy you might have used to answer your question?

In DT, we have been challenging ourselves to be chefs and look at the nutritional values of a range of breads from around the world. Last week, we had an eventual session making flatbreads. We tried a range of ingredients including mozzarella cheese, caramelised onions and even olives! It was all going so well until we had to fry them! A fire evacuation and a shocked Mrs Norman face meant we did not get a chance to cook everyone's, but I hope you enjoyed tasting them at home! This week, we made the Danish delicacy of Smorrebrod (an open sandwich on rye bread). We chopped a range of vegetables and made Harissa Yoghurt and Marie Rose sauce which we weren't all too keen on! We demolished these and all rated them highly – I was impressed with everyone for trying my red onion and tomato version, with a bit of both sauces!

A couple of reminders:

- Reading Records are being checked on a Friday morning so make sure yours is in up to 10 dojos are offered if you read every night.
- Homework starts this week make sure it is back in on a Wednesday, so you are ready for the next set.

Chocolate Cake by Michael Rosen, illustrated by Kevin Waldron

When a young boy sneaks downstairs at night, his plan to just look at the chocolate cake turns into a full-blown midnight feast. The laugh-out-loud poetic narrative captures his attempts to clean up the mess. But not everything goes as planned. Waldron's illustrations, with lively text layouts and speech bubbles, ramps up Rosen's sense of fun. It's a surefire winner for reading to Year 1 classes.



The Boy Who Grew Dragons by Andy Shepherd

A funny, heart-warming and captivating adventure about a boy whose dragon fruit from the tree in his garden begins hatching. He soon finds that caring for a small dragon is no easy task. And then more and more dragon fruits start to hatch... It's perfect to read to your child or use as a Year 3 class reader.



Danny the Champion of the World by Roald Dahl

Danny and his father William live in a caravan mending cars for a living, although Danny's father also has a dangerous sideline in poaching pheasants. A gripping and at times visceral story that is peppered with humour and warmth, this is one of the more challenging and thought-provoking children's novels by Roald Dahl.
