Maple Class




Welcome back!

The children have had a great start to the new academic year. In Maths, we have been building numbers.






























We also enjoyed playing musical instruments in our music lessons!

Attendance Matters



THANKYOU, grown-ups for the early alarms set to get the children to school in good time to start their day. I have had to set three each morning!

As Mrs Norman has already mentioned that attendance is a focus for the school this year and in my role as the school attendance officer I feel it's important to keep the whole school community updated and informed of how we can all work together to achieve good attendance for all of our children. So, I would ask anyone who has any concerns or simply questions about their child's attendance to please come and talk to us. We are here to support!

You can speak to your child's teacher if you prefer or just pop along to the office to speak to myself or Mrs Norman.

There is a minor change this term to arrivals after 8:50a.m through the main entrance. A member of the office staff will now log the time and reason for lateness. We are all human and appreciate that there are sometimes things outside of our control which can delay us in the morning and make us late. School is required to record the time and reason for late arrivals on the school register, so please do not be offended when staff ask for the reason. Arrivals between 8:50 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. will be marked 'L' on the register – late before register has closed. Arrivals after 9:01a.m and marked 'U' – unauthorised.

Hopefully, you have all received the new school attendance information leaflet by now. Please read this and keep it for reference. It includes important information and guidance on school procedures. I will be sharing more information with you all during the year and as ever please ask if you have any questions.
