
We will also start working on the nativity- watch this space!





The class have been creative and getting their hands wet making felt flowers.







# **Attendance Matters**



I would like to share an image from the school's attendance information leaflet, following a recent conversation with some parents on attendance percentages and what they mean in terms of missed learning for a child. If like me a percentage of 80% and above seems respectable, as 100% would be the best possible attainment, then please read on. I was shocked to learn that 80% attendance means that over the year a child will have missed almost 8 weeks of learning. At 85% a child will have missed a whole half terms learning.

It only takes the odd day throughout the year for a child's attendance to suffer and their learning time to be impacted.

So, I would ask you all to please remember these figures. Be mindful of an odd day here and there, as they all add up over the school year. Should you, one day, find yourself having to decide whether your child should stay at home or go to school.... 'One day won't hurt' really isn't the case at all!

As always, should you wish to talk to a member of staff about your child's attendance please do either speak to their teacher, Mrs Norman, or myself.

It has been really encouraging to see fewer late arrivals since September and feedback from teachers is that morning routines in classrooms are having a positive effect on how quickly the children are settling into their day. Thank you all for your continued support.
